We acknowledge receipt on October 12, 2022, of a request from the Mayor of Williamson County (the "County") for approval of a 4-year lease financing in an amount not to exceed \$277,292 to be known as the "Apple Computer Equipment Lease Financing, Series 2022" (the "Lease Financing").

Included with the request was a Plan of Lease Financing for the proposed purchase of Apple computer equipment/software and accessories for the Williamson County Board of Education. Please send a copy of the executed Lease Financing Agreement to us along with the completed Debt Report within forty-five (45) days of the issuance of the debt herein approved.

Approval

This letter constitutes approval for the County to enter into the Lease Financing pursuant to Title 9, Chapter 24, Part 1 of Tennessee Code Annotated.

The County is responsible for ensuring compliance with Title 9, Chapter 24, Part 1 of the Tennessee Code Annotated, its debt management policy, and timely payments under the Lease Financing Agreement.

This letter and the approval to issue debt do not address the compliance with federal tax regulations and should not be relied upon for that purpose. The County should discuss these issues with a tax attorney or bond counsel.

This approval is valid for six months after the date of this letter. If the debt has not been transacted within that time, a new request must be submitted to this office for approval. Please notify us if the County decides not to enter into the Lease Financing.

Terms and Life

The maximum maturity for the Lease Financing as authorized by the governing body is 4 fiscal years. The terms of the Lease Financing are reasonable and comparable to debt being issued in current markets.

Based upon our review, the repayment terms are in the public's interest and the Plan of Lease Financing appears to meet the requirements of Tenn. Code Ann. § 9-24-104.

Balloon Indebtedness

The structure of the Lease Financing does not appear to be balloon indebtedness as defined in Tenn. Code Ann. § 9-21-133.





REPORT FOR ACCEPTANCE OF CRIMSON LEAF LANE, AND EDGEMORE DRIVE, FALLS GROVE SUBDIVISION, SECTION THREE, AS A PART OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY ROAD SYSTEM.

Re: HIGHWAY LAWS OF WILLIAMSON COUNTY May 1988

Chapter 373, Tennessee General Assembly Private Acts of 1937.

Section 18: That any petition for the opening, changing, closing or acceptance of road as County Roads, shall be directed to the Board of Highway commissioners and the petition shall describe the road in detail, giving the termini, length, course and width, and shall be accompanied by a map thereof drawn to scale, and may include such other matters as the petitioner or petitioners may urge upon the Commissioners and the County Court for the acceptance of said road as a county road. It shall be the duty of the Board of Highway commissioners, upon said petition being filed with them, to investigate the advisability of opening or changing such road, and submit a written report to the county court showing the assessed value of property abutting thereon, the amount of travel taken care of by said road, and such other matters as would throw light upon its importance as a county road. The Commission shall then at the next term of the Quarterly Court make its recommendation as to whether the road should or should not be accepted as a county road, or opened, or closed, or changed, and the Quarterly County Court may take such action as it deems best. The original petition and map submitted by the petitioners shall remain on file in the office of the County Judge.

DISCUSSION

This report indicates the above referenced roadways have a forty (40) foot right-of-way, with the exception of 329.6 feet of Crimson Leaf Lane, beginning at the intersection of Falls Grove Drive. This section of roadway has a right of way 36.16 feet. The roadway length for Crimson Leaf Lane is .530. The roadway length for Edgemore Drive is .044 tenths of a mile. The assessed value of the properties abutting the roadways is \$14,324,400.00 as recorded in the office of the Williamson County Tax Assessor. Falls Grove Subdivision is located within the Southeast district. Staff recommends acceptance of the above mentioned roadways including all dedicated right-of-way as shown on the recorded plat.

ROADWAY CONDITION

The present surface of the roadway is asphalt (E Mix), in good condition, with a width of twenty-six (26) feet. The roadways are bordered by a concrete curb and gutter on each side of the roadway. Roadways have been constructed in accordance with the specifications and details as shown in the Williamson County Subdivision Regulations, APPENDIX F, (Specifications for Subdivision Roadway & Drainage Construction).

TRAFFIC

The estimated traffic count for an average day, at ten trips per household is two hundred and twenty (220) trips per day.

BUILD-OUT

The build-out for this section of the development is at 100%.

SIDEWALKS / HANDICAP RAMPS

There are sidewalks within this section of the development. The sidewalks are located outside the right of way. Handicap ramps are located within the right of way at the following locations:

- 1. Crimson Leaf lane and Edgemore Drive
- 2. Crimson Leaf Lane and Falls Grove Drive

CONCLUSION

It is the recommendation of the Williamson County Highway Commission that:

- 1. This road meets the requirements of acceptance and addition to the Williamson County Road list; and
- 2. The petition for acceptance was initiated by a member of the Williamson County Commission.
- The county legislative body replaced the "quarterly county court" as provided in the Public Acts of 1978, Chapter 934, Tenn. Code Ann. §§ 5-5-101 et. seq.
- The title "county judge" was replaced with the title "county executive" and then, unless formally entitled county execute by private act, redesignated as the "county mayor." Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-6-101.



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
