# A RESOLUTION TO AMEND SECTION 11.03(B)(10) OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE REGARDING FAMILY SUBDIVISIONS

- WHEREAS, Section 11.03(B)(10) of the Zoning Ordinance outlines specific standards for Family Subdivisions, which are defined as "the division of a lot or parcel for the purpose of sale or gift to a member of the immediate family of the property owner, where the lot to be created does not meet the minimum size requirement of the Zoning District in which it is located."; and
- WHEREAS, the Family Subdivision provisions were created in order to allow the creation of a lot that is less than five acres in size (even though it is located in a zoning district that otherwise requires lots of five acres or greater) if such lot is to be sold or given to a member of one's immediate family; and
- WHEREAS, in order to ensure that this Family Subdivision option isn't misused, the Ordinance requires that a restrictive covenant be placed on the property prohibiting its transfer to a non-immediate family member for a period of 15 years following recordation of the subdivision; and
- WHEREAS, Planning Staff was recently made aware of a situation where a lender was unwilling to approve a construction loan for a Family Subdivision lot because the lender felt that the language of the restrictive covenant would prohibit the bank from taking over the property in the event of a foreclosure; and
- WHEREAS, to address this, and other similar circumstances, Staff is proposing to add language that would allow a Family Subdivision lot to be transferred to a non-immediate family member within the 15-year period "... when such lot is subject to an involuntary transfer such as foreclosure, death, judicial sale, condemnation or bankruptcy."; and
- WHEREAS, based upon its consideration of all the information, Staff recommendation, public comment and its own Public Hearing, the Williamson County Regional Planning Commission has recommended the adoption of the amendment as presented; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds and determines that the best interests of Williamson County and its citizens will be served by the adoption of this amendment to the Zoning Ordinance as recommended by the Regional Planning Commission; and
- WHEREAS, due notice has been published and a public hearing has been held as required by the Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 13, Chapter 7, Part 1.
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Williamson County Board of Commissioners at its regular meeting on this the 13 th day of November, 2023, after conducting the public hearing as required by law, hereby adopts the amendment to the Williamson County Zoning Ordinance, which is attached hereto and incorporated herein as if included verbatim, in accordance with its authority in Tennessee Code Annotated, Title 13, Chapter 7, Part 1.

# RESOLUTION TO AMEND SECTION 11.03 (B) OF THE ZONING ORDINANCE REGARDING FAMILY SUBDIVISIONS

#### STAFF REPORT

Section 11.03(B)(10) of the Zoning Ordinance outlines specific standards for Family Subdivisions, which are defined as "the division of a lot or parcel for the purpose of sale or gift to a member of the immediate family of the property owner, where the lot to be created does not meet the minimum size requirement of the Zoning District in which it is located."

The Family Subdivision provisions were created in order to allow the creation of a lot that is less than five acres in size (even though it is located in a zoning district that otherwise requires lots of five acres or greater) if such lot is to be sold or given to a member of one's immediate family.

In order to ensure that this Family Subdivision option isn't misused, the Ordinance requires that a restrictive covenant be placed on the property prohibiting its transfer to a non-immediate family member for a period of 15 years following recordation of the subdivision. However, Staff was recently made aware of a situation where a lender was unwilling to approve a construction loan for a Family Subdivision lot because the lender felt that the language of the restrictive covenant would prohibit the bank from taking over the property in the event of a foreclosure.

To address this, and other similar circumstances, Staff is proposing to add language that would allow a Family Subdivision lot to be transferred to a non-immediate family member within the 15-year period "... when such lot is subject to an involuntary transfer such as foreclosure, death, judicial sale, condemnation or bankruptcy."

Staff recommends approval of this Text Amendment, believing that the proposed language provides for circumstances that are beyond the control of the property owner, while continuing to ensure that the Family Subdivision option is not misused.

#### **FAMILY SUBDIVISIONS TEXT AMENDMENT**

Revise Section 11.03(B)(10)g) as follows (new language in red font):

g) The owner of any lot created via a family subdivision shall place a restrictive covenant on the property to prohibit its transfer to a non-immediate family member for a period of 15 years following recordation of the subdivision, unless such lot is subject to an involuntary transfer such as foreclosure, death, judicial sale, condemnation or bankruptcy.

RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY MAYOR TO EXECUTE AGREEMENTS WITH CERTAIN ORGANIZATIONS PROVIDING OPIOID REMEDIATION AND ABATEMENT SERVICES AND APPROPRIATING FUNDS FOR THOSE SERVICES - APPROPRIATIONS TO COME FROM OPIOID ABATEMENT FUNDS

WHEREAS, in December of 2017 Williamson County ("County") joined litigation to hold manufacturers of prescription opioids and their related companies, and pharmaceutical wholesale drug distributors accountable for their contribution to the opioid epidemic; and

WHEREAS, to date, the County has received \$1.1 million directly and indirectly from the distributors, manufacturers, and retailers of opioid medications through the National Opioid Settlement ("Opioid Abatement Funds"); and

WHEREAS, The National Opioid Settlement court order imposes conditions on the Opioid Abatement Funds, including that they be used only for opioid remediation and abatement purposes; and

WHEREAS, the Williamson County Opioid Abatement Task Force ("Task Force") was established to accept and review applications from individuals and entities that desire to receive money from the Opioid Abatement Funds or that propose methods for using the Opioid Abatement Funds to serve the County's citizens; and

WHEREAS, the Task Force has reviewed the applications that were submitted in response to their announcement of funding for opioid abatement and remediation projects and has recommended which applications meet the conditions to receive the funds and in what amount; and

WHEREAS, finding it to be in the best interest of the citizens of Williamson County, the Williamson County Board of Commissioners affirms the Task Force's decision to fund each selected applicant for opioid abatement and remediation services in compliance with the conditions as specified in the National Opioid Settlement court order, authorizes the Williamson County Mayor to execute the agreements on behalf of Williamson County with each selected applicant for opioid remediation and abatement services and activities, and approves appropriating Williamson County's Opioid Abatement Funds as further described below:

- 5. That it is the expressed interest of the County Commission of Williamson County in providing these funds to the above-named organizations to be fully in compliance with the National Opioid Settlements and any and all laws which may apply to County appropriations; and so these appropriations are made subject to compliance with any and all of these laws, regulations, and the National Settlement Agreements.

# RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY MAYOR TO EXECUTE AN AGREEMENT TO PURCHASE THE BROADCAST RADIO STATION LICENSE COMMONLY KNOWN AS WAKM 950 AM IN FRANKLIN, TENNESSEE

- **WHEREAS,** pursuant to *Tennessee Code Annotated, Section 5-7-101*, Williamson County (the "County") may acquire and hold property for County purposes and make all contracts necessary to acquire interest in property; and
- WHEREAS, Heritage Broadcast Associates in Franklin, Tennessee, (the "Seller") desire to sell the broadcast radio station license commonly known as WAKM 950 AM ("WAKM-AM"); and
- WHEREAS, the County is the recipient of funds disbursed from the United States Government pursuant to the American Rescue Plan Act ("ARPA" or the "Act"); and
- WHEREAS, the County Board of Commissioners (the "Board of Commissioners") is responsible for the expenditure of said funds in furtherance of the goals and guidelines contained in the Act and the associated Final Interim Rule released by the U.S. Treasury Secretary in August 2023; and
- WHEREAS, the funds the County received pursuant to ARPA are to be used for the purpose of responding to the public health emergency and the negative economic consequences that resulted from the COVID-19 pandemic, including lost government revenue; and
- WHEREAS, WAKM-AM, a high-power AM transmitter, provides radio communications in twenty-two Middle Tennessee counties, including Williamson County; and
- WHEREAS, the County currently owns two portable low-power AM transmitters ("low-power transmitter(s)") that can be deployed to locations across the county to provide emergency information to small areas, one transmitter only covering about 2 miles and the other covering the size of a parking lot; and
- WHEREAS, the County's low-power transmitters were used during the COVID-19 pandemic at the vaccination site; and
- WHEREAS, AM broadcast radio can still be on the air in the absence of electricity, cellular platforms, internet services, and other infrastructure; and
- WHEREAS, the County desires the acquisition of WAKM-AM, a high-power AM transmitter, in order to communicate import messages to all of its residents in times of emergency when electricity, internet, and cellular services are unreliable; and
- WHEREAS, in the initial hours of the aftermath of a disaster, informing County residents of how they should respond and how they can receive support is essential to ensuring their safety and helping the area recover; and
- WHEREAS, the County has agreed to contribute four hundred and thirty thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$430,000) in ARPA funds to purchase WAKM-AM; and
- WHEREAS, finding it to be in the interest of the citizens of Williamson County, the Williamson County Board of Commissioners authorizes the purchase of the Seller's interest in WAKM-AM to permit Williamson County to provide vital information to its residents during an emergency:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Commissioners, meeting in regular session this 13<sup>th</sup> day of November, 2023, hereby authorizes the purchase of the Seller's interest in the broadcast radio license described as WAKM-AM using four hundred and thirty thousand and 00/100 Dollars (\$430,000) of the County's ARPA funds, and authorizes the County Mayor to execute all documents needed to purchase Heritage Broadcast Associates' interest in WAKM 950 AM.



#### The following conditions are overruled by action of the Williamson County Commission:

- Buffer enhancement is required along the Stream. The enhancement should include removal of
  invasive species and the reestablishment of native species which provide a mix of canopy trees,
  understory trees, shrubs, and native seek mix of forbs/grasses/rushes that are suitable for a moist,
  shaded understory environment.
- The Landscape contractor is to coordinate all stream buffer efforts with the City's stormwater inspector for the site. The contractor is to contact the inspector before beginning work to outline the scope of work within the stream buffer. The City inspector will document all stages of work through final stabilization, failure to contact the City inspector may result in partial or full landscape bond withholding.
- Invasive species shall be removed by the Contractor by means of hand removing the plant and large roots. The contractor shall apply weed suppressant until to adequately suppress re-emergence. It is recommended to apply in warm and dry weather and as often as necessary, following the manufacturer's label. The contractor is to follow Tennessee's guidelines for list of invasive plant species to be removed.
- No mowing, clearing, or any construction related services disturbance of vegetation in the riparian puffer except as permitted by the City Engineer or their Representative.
- Quantity of plant material for the buffer enhancement is based on the criteria from the Urban Riparian Handbook calculation of:
  - o 10' strip, adjacent to the Stream Bank
  - o 2" Cal. Plants installed instead of bare root for a reduction in quantity.
- Large nursery stock plant material to be installed instead of bare root for a reduction in quantity

- WHEREAS, pursuant to the Rules, Regulations and Procedures ("Rules") for the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, a rule shall remain in effect until such time as it is appealed or amended; and
- WHEREAS, Rule 11 provides that any amendment to the Rules requires only a majority vote if the proposed amendment is introduced to the Board of Commissioners at the October or November meeting; and
- WHEREAS, Tenn. Code Ann. § 5-5-111(a)(2) requires that public notice of a vacancy be given in a newspaper of general circulation in the county at least seven (7) days prior to the meeting of the body at which the office is to be filled; and
- WHEREAS, currently, Rule 7.1 provides that the Board of Commissioners should be notified with the agenda when an office is to be filled or a vacancy in an office occurs by the County Clerk; and, that public notice should be given in a newspaper of general circulation in Williamson County at least seven (7) days prior to the Board of Commissioners' meeting at which the office is to be filled; and
- **WHEREAS,** currently, Rule 7.1 allows Commissioners to nominate candidates on the floor for vacant positions during a meeting of the County Commissioners; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have determined that the public should receive at least thirty (30) days' notice in a newspaper of general circulation and the Board of Commissioners should receive at least thirty (30) days' notice of a vacancy that is elected by the Commission:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, meeting in regular session this the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 2023, by a majority vote and upon recommendation of the Rules Committee, make the following revisions to the Rules, Regulations and Procedures for the Williamson County Board of Commissioners:

Amend Rule 7.1.a by deleting it and replacing it with the following:

- a. Whenever an office is required to be filled, or a vacancy occurs in any office required to be filled, by the Board of Commissioners, the County Clerk shall provide notice to every Commissioner of the need to fill the office or vacancy at least thirty (30) days prior to the Board of Commissioners' meeting at which the office is to be filled. In addition, the Chairperson shall direct that public notice be given in a newspaper of general circulation in Williamson County at least thirty (30) days prior to the Board of Commissioners' meeting at which the office is to be filled, notifying the public of the vacancy or opening and specifying the office or offices to be filled at the meeting.
- AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of this resolution and its signing, the Board of Commissioners directs the County Clerk's Office to make the revisions to the Rules, Regulations and Procedures of the Board of County Commissioners.

# RESOLUTION AMENDING THE RULES, REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS CONCERNING THE DATE AND TIME OF THE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS' REGULARLY SCHEDULED MEETING

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Rule 11 of the Rules, Regulations and Procedures ("Rules") for the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, a rule shall remain in effect until such time as it is appealed or amended; and
- WHEREAS, Rule 11 provides that any amendment to the Rules requires a two-thirds majority vote if the proposed amendment is introduced to any regularly scheduled meeting other than the October or November meeting; and
- WHEREAS, Rule 1 provides that the Board of Commissioners shall meet at 7:00 p.m. on the second Monday of January, February, March, May, June, September, October, and November of each year, and at 7:00 p.m. on the fourth Monday in June; and
- WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners have determined that the meeting on the fourth Monday in June should instead occur on the third Thursday of June:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, meeting in regular session this the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 2023, by a two-thirds majority vote and upon recommendation of the Rules Committee, makes the following revisions to Rule 1 of the Rules, Regulations and Procedures for the Williamson County Board of Commissioners:

Amend Rule 1 by deleting the current language and replacing it with the following paragraph:

The Board of Commissioners shall meet at 7:00 p.m. on the second Monday of January, February, March, May, June, July, September, October, and November of each year, and at 7:00 p.m. on the third Thursday in June, of each year for the purpose of adopting an annual budget. Should a meeting date of the Board of County Commissioners fall on a legal holiday or an emergency arise, either the Chairman or a vote of a majority of the Board of Commissioners may hold the scheduled meeting on the following workday after the holiday or emergency. Notification to the members will be the responsibility of the Chairperson of the Board in conjunction with the County Mayor, and an agenda and the resolution packet shall be mailed to each Commissioner at least six (6) days prior to each session.

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that upon approval of this resolution and its signing, the Board of Commissioners directs the County Clerk's Office to make the revisions to the Rules, Regulations and Procedures of the Board of County Commissioners.

# A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE RULES, REGULATIONS AND PROCEDURES OF THE WILLIAMSON COUNTY BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS TO ESTABLISH A LEGISLATIVE STANDING COMMITTEE TO REVIEW, STUDY, AND MONITOR STATE LEGISLATION RELATED TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS

- WHEREAS, pursuant to Rule 11 of the Rules, Regulations and Procedures ("Rules") of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, a rule shall remain in effect until such time as it is appealed or amended; and
- WHEREAS, Rule 11 provides that if a rule is appealed or amended during the October or November County Commission meeting it requires only a majority vote and not a two-thirds majority vote; and
- WHEREAS, pursuant to Rule 8.3.b.3 of the Rules, Regulations and Procedures of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, the Steering Committee may establish new standing committees upon approval of the Board of Commissioners; and
- WHEREAS, the Williamson County Board of Commissioners has an interest in monitoring proposed state legislation that impacts county government; and
- WHEREAS, by passage of this resolution, the Williamson County Board of Commissioners finds it in the best interest of the citizens of Williamson County to establish a Legislative Standing Committee to monitor proposed state legislation and to garner and exchange ideas, proposals, and concerns regarding state legislation that may impact county governments:
- NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by a majority vote of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, meeting in regular session, this the 13<sup>th</sup> day of November 2023, upon recommendation of the Steering Committee, amends the Rules, Regulations and Procedures of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners and establishes a Legislative Standing Committee to review state legislation affecting county government and to report to the Board of Commissioners as a new subsection 8.3.j. to read as follows:
  - j. Legislative Committee
    - 1. This Committee will consist of three (3) or five (5) Commissioners to be chosen annually at the September Board of Commissioners meeting.
    - 2. The duties of the Committee shall be to review, study, monitor, recommend, and report to the Board of Commissioners, desired new state legislation and the impact of proposed state legislation on county governments.
- **BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the creation of the Legislative Committee shall be contingent upon the Board of Commissioners approving this resolution and shall operate under the Rules, Regulations and Procedures of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners in the same manner as other committees;

AND BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this resolution shall take effect from and after the date of its passage of the Williamson County Board of Commissioners, the public welfare requiring it.
