
Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area July 2024





SCHOOL RESOURCE OFFICERS (SRO) & CRIME PREVENTION

SRO Activity

School is on summer break from late May until the start of the 2024-2025 school year. WCS begins a student half-day on Monday, August 5, 2024, and FSSD begins their first student half-day on Wednesday, August 7, 2024.

Crime Prevention

Like June, the month of July had less events while schools are on break and educational visits are paused. However, thirteen hours were spent in community immersion including the City of Fairview's 4th of July Celebration. Multiple emergency response agencies throughout the county attended. Our presence sparked conversations and relationships with the community. Other notable community-focused events were a book reading/Q&A with a local preschool and a police academy themed birthday party for a young pair of twins who requested we join in their celebration. We were happy to do so.

Laurelbrooke held its monthly Neighborhood Watch meeting, and they have begun implementing more of the services of the Williamson County Sheriff's Office. This is huge progress for community immersion, building positive interactions with law enforcement and giving the residents a sense of peace and safety.


The Crime Prevention Division now has a DARE Certified Instructor in Deputy Zach Taylor, who completed the 80-hour program training. He has already begun reaching out to schools to discuss reviving or implementing the program as soon as possible.






