Greetings to all. I'm happy to provide you with the Monthly Report for November 2024. First and foremost, I would like to wish each and every one of you a Merry Christmas, a blessed Holiday Season, and a Happy New Year.

Please note that the staffing numbers in this report are different than what I've previously reported to you. The reason is the numbers you see here do not reflect job offers that have been made to those employees who are awaiting a start date, pending background investigations. As of today, we only have 17 vacant positions at the WCSO that are unfilled. We are extremely happy with our recruitment efforts and staffing levels to date. You might be interested to know that since taking office, I have hired 56 new employees, 5 employees have retired, and 28 employees have either been terminated or resigned voluntarily.

Secondly, I would like to highlight the efforts of our Narcotics Investigators in this report. If you will note on Page 7, we provide information about a joint operation that netted several arrests and a large amount of seized property. Our Narcotics Investigators seemingly are involved in an operation of some magnitude daily. I'm convinced that our hard line stance and efforts in combating drugs correlates to less violent crime in our county. I've attached 2 photos here from the aforementioned operation.

Finally, I want to share a recent photo of all WCSO employees who participated in the FOP Shop w/a Cop benefit at Wal-Mart this past Sunday. Our turnout was remarkable! I'm told it was our best turnout ever. I'm so proud of our team selflessly giving of their time to participate in this annual event. We actually had more Deputies than we had children to shop for – another first I'm told. Best Regards, and I'm happy to answer any questions.






Self-Initiated Activity November 2024




Patrol/K-9/Traffic Activity by Area November 2024





Mental Health Co-Responder

Since 2022, WCSO partners with Volunteer Behavioral Health Care System through grant funding for a co-responder program to improve response to mental health crises in this county. The co-responder position is vacant as of the end of September. Until VBHCS fills this position or an alternative solution is found, WCSO is utilizing Tennessee's Mobile Crisis Services when needed. No co-responder monthly data is available for October.

Narcotics Highlight: A large investigation conducted by WCSO Narcotics and the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation concluded in October. Two search warrants for meth distribution in Williamson County and Middle Tennessee were executed near both the county line and an elementary school, resulting in an arrest and multiple seizures. This included (approximately): 47.5 lbs of meth, 3.5 lbs of fentanyl, 23 grams of marijuana, a pill press, cutting agents and packaging material, high end tire rims, a flat screen tv, \$15,000 U.S. currency, 28 pairs of shoes valued together at \$100,000, expensive jewelry, designer sunglasses and bags, two money counters, three guns, and a Dodge Durango SRT. This was not detailed in the October report due to pending press releases at the time.

SPECIAL OPERATIONS

Aviation

Aviation performed overwatch several times for both the WCSO Narcotics Unit and the Franklin PD Flex Team when they interacted with vehicles as part of their investigations. For community interaction, Air1 flew to Southern Hills Church of Christ Sunshine Preschool for school events, and to Sunshine School for a homeschool event. They also performed flyovers at the Veteran's Day Parade, and the Tunnel to Towers groundbreaking ceremony. Tunnel to Towers provides mortgage-free homes to Gold Star and fallen first responder families with young children, and builds specially adapted smart homes for catastrophically injured veterans and first responders. They will be building such homes on three lots in Williamson County.

Crime Prevention


November began with providing our highly popular internet safety lecture to a local Girl Scout Troop. This continues to be the most requested lecture for the division, and feedback from both parents and children has been positive. Allendale Elementary resumed the DARE program after several weeks of unpredicted scheduling conflicts caused interruption. The program has now resumed, and student feedback on its return has been strongly positive and encouraging. A local Boy Scout Troop held a den meeting at College Grove Elementary highlighting first responders, which included WCSO. Approximately 30 scouts attended the meeting and observed how the multiple first responder disciplines work together. The Paychecks for Veterans Job Fair was held in Nashville where WCSO was touted with esteem as a place for employment. Graceland Church held their annual Fall Festival with about 1,000 citizens in attendance in an opportunity for first responders and the community to get to know each other. Laurelbrooke Subdivision held their monthly neighborhood watch meeting and reminded all residents of taking extra precautions to ensure a safe upcoming holiday season.

The monthly county convenience center checks were also performed to replace any boxes if needed and to restock personal-sized litterbags. Crime Prevention spent approximately 17 hours in community immersion during November.




No Sheriff's Sale occurred in November, and no arrests were made under the efforts of the US Marshals Task Force. Warrants personnel completed 18 training hours during the month.




■ Males Booked ■ Females Booked
